Dependency ratios in Thailand, an MIC in Southeast Asia, 1980–2030

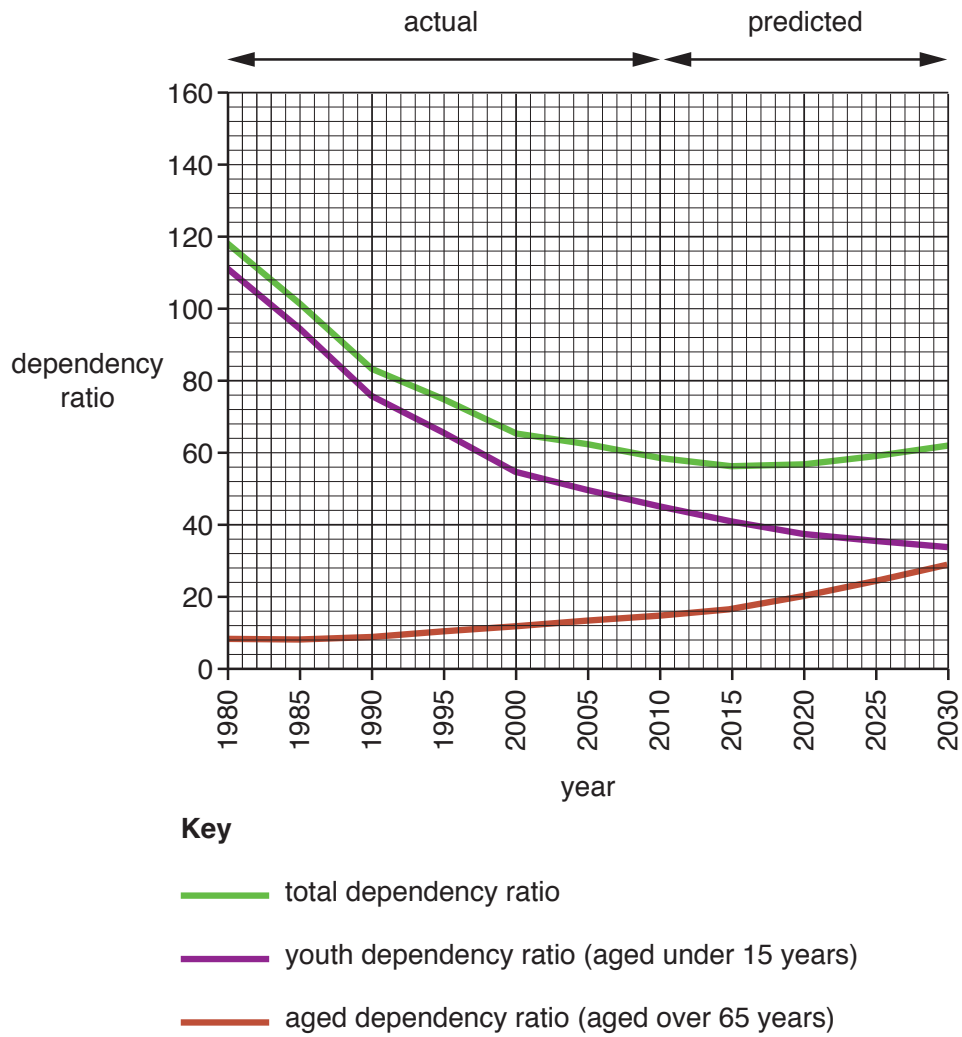


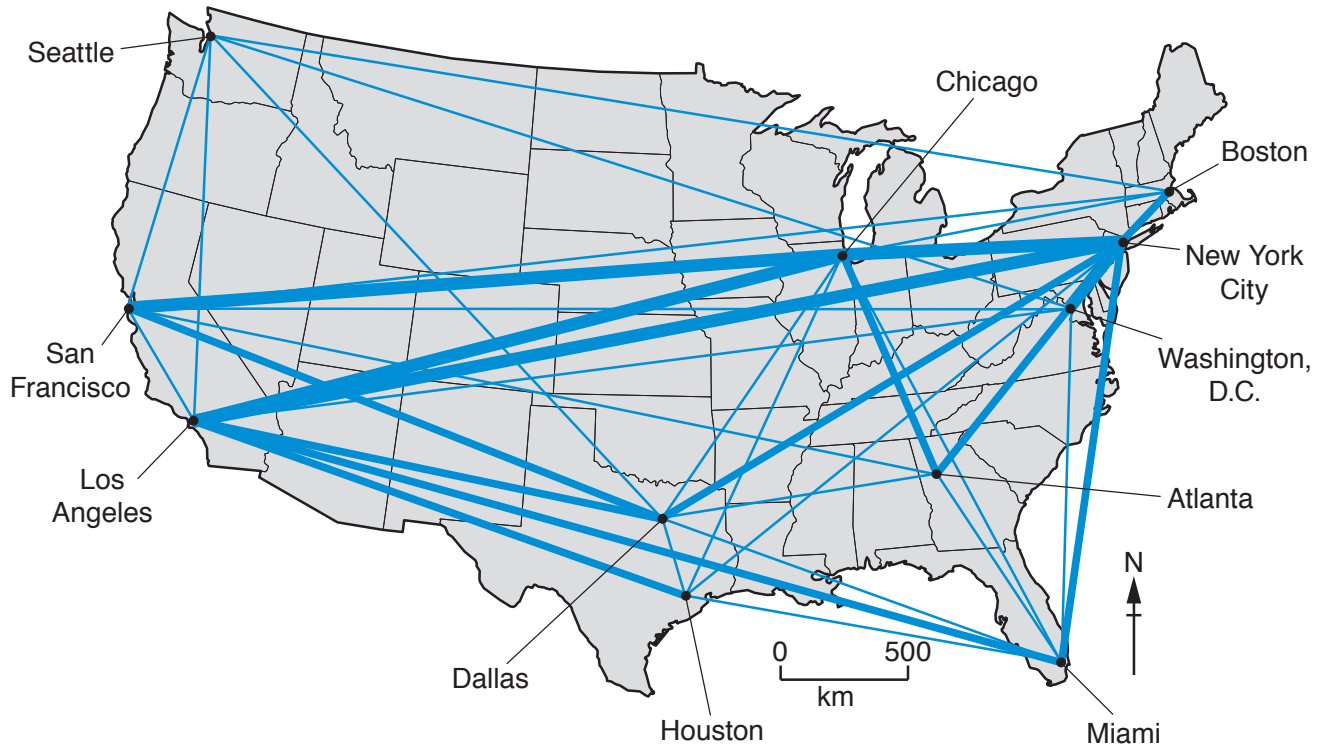
