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

**Section A: Applied Anatomy and Physiology**

- 1 (a) Complete a movement analysis of the upward phase of a bench press (Fig. 1.1) for both the elbow and the shoulder joints. Your analysis should include the joint type, the movement occurring and the working muscle. [6]

- (b) Games such as football, netball and basketball can put a lot of strain on the knee joint. Identify **four** structures of the knee joint that provide stability. Explain why this joint is susceptible to injury when playing certain sports. [6]
- (c) When the body starts to exercise, heart rate increases. Explain the intrinsic and hormonal control of heart rate. [5]
- (d) Describe **two** mechanisms that help maintain venous return during exercise. [4]
- (e) Explain the role of haemoglobin and myoglobin in the transport of oxygen to the muscle cell. [4]
- (f) Explain the process of gaseous exchange between the alveoli and capillaries. How does the structure of the alveoli and the capillaries aid this process? [5]

- 2 (a) Using practical examples describe **four** different characteristics of skilful performance. [4]
- (b) Give **three** characteristics of an open skill. [3]
- (c) Motivation to learn movement skills can be affected by drive reduction.  
Explain the concept of drive reduction. [4]
- (d) Bandura's observational learning theory is one way of describing the learning of movement skills and involves the following elements:
- Attention → retention → motor reproduction → motivation.
- Describe each of these elements of observational learning. [4]
- (e) Explain how the short term memory and the long term memory are used in performing movement skills. [4]
- (f) Using a practical example explain what is meant by closed loop control when learning or performing movement skills. [5]
- (g) How would a coach or teacher use their knowledge of schema theory in their coaching or teaching? [6]

- (d)** Explain the factors which may influence an individual's participation in sporting activity. [8]
