- Evaluate the efficiency of the markup for these pages and explain how improvements could be made. [4]

- 2 • Using a suitable software package, open the web page **nov163gtb.htm**
- Replace the text *A Candidate, ZZ999, 9999* with your name, Centre number and candidate number.

- 3 • Replace the text *Image B* with the image **163logo.jpg**
- Resize this image to 1000 pixels high by 380 pixels wide.
- Make sure that appropriate text is displayed if this image is not available. [3]
- 4 • Using the most appropriate image from **163img1.jpg** to **163img8.jpg**, replace the text:
  - *Image C* with the image of a chef preparing food
  - *Image D* with the image of an elephant ride
  - *Image E* with the image of a river boat. [3]
- 5 • Make the text *Click here* a hyperlink to return to the top of the page. [3]
- 6 • Make the text *Hothouse Design* a hyperlink to send an email message to: **hothouse-design@cie.org.uk** with a subject line **Web design enquiry** [5]
- 7 • Set the name for a default target window to **\_self** [2]
- 8 • Make the image of the elephant ride a hyperlink to the web page for the Goa Elephant Sanctuary to open in a new window called **\_blank**
- Save the web page. [3]

### Task 3 – Spreadsheet

You are going to prepare a spreadsheet to calculate the advertising costs charged by Hothouse Design to each hotel in Goa. Use the most efficient formulae. Display all currency values in Indian rupees to 2 decimal places. For example, ₹12.00 or INR 12.00

1 rupee = 100 paise

- 12 • Using a suitable software package, load the file **163resort.csv**
- Save this file as a spreadsheet with the file name **163\_** and your Centre number and candidate number. For example, 163\_ZZ999\_9999
  - Place an automated file name which includes the file path, on the right in the header. [1]
- 13 • Insert 4 new rows before row 1. [1]
- 14 • In cell A1 enter the title:  
**Hothouse Design costs for the Goan Tourist Board** [1]
- 15 • Merge cells A1 to G1.
- Format this cell to have a black background, with a white, 36 point, centre aligned, sans-serif font.
  - Make sure all the text is fully visible. [5]
- 16 • In cell F3 enter the text **Rate**
- In cell F4 enter **124.2** rupees. [1]
- 17 • Make the contents of cells in the rows starting with *Resort* and *Number of rooms...* bold and underlined. [1]
- 18 • In cell D6 enter a function to look up from the external file **163taluka.csv** the *Taluka name* for this resort. [6]
- 19 • In cell E6 enter a function to look up from the external file **163taluka.csv** the *Location* for this resort. [4]
- 20 • In cell G6 enter a formula to calculate the advertising cost which is the rate (entered in step 16) multiplied by:
- **25** if the *resort* has 50 or less rooms
  - **75** if the *resort* has more than 50 but less than 101 rooms
  - **150** if the *resort* has more than 100 but less than 201 rooms
  - **200** if the *resort* has more than 200 rooms. [8]

- 21 • In cell B27 enter a formula to add the number of rooms for the location in column A. [4]
- 22 • Replicate the formulae entered in steps 18, 19, and 20 for each resort.  
• Replicate the formula entered in step 21 for each location. [1]
- 23 • Apply appropriate formatting to all cells. [1]
- 24 • Save and print the spreadsheet showing the formulae. Make sure:
- your name, Centre number and candidate number are entered in an appropriate place on your spreadsheet
  - it is in landscape orientation
  - the row and column headings are displayed
  - the contents of all cells are fully visible. [2]

- 25 • Print the spreadsheet showing the values. Make sure:
- it is in portrait orientation
  - the printout fits on a single page

- 26 • Change the data model so that the resort *Sun Village* has an extra 50 rooms added. [1]

  - the printout fits on a single page
  - the contents of all cells are fully visible.
