	(c)	'The birth stories in Matthew's Gospel tell us very little about Jesus.' To what extent do you agree? Show in your answer that you have considered more than one point of view.	
2	(a)	Give an account of the parable of the sower. [6]	
	(b)	What did Jesus teach about the meaning of this parable? [6]	
	(c)	'Jesus taught in parables so that some people would not understand.' To what extent do you agree? Show in your answer that you have considered more than one point of view.	
3	(a)	Give an account of what happened when Jesus walked on water. [6]	
	(b)	Explain what this miracle may show about the person and work of Jesus. [6]	
	(c)	'It is easier to explain away Jesus' nature miracles than his healing miracles.' To what extent do you agree? Show in your answer that you have considered more than one point of view.	
4	(a)	(i) Give an account of what led up to Jesus saying to Peter 'Get behind me, Satan!'.	
		(ii) What did Jesus then explain to his disciples? [6]	
	(b)	Explain what the Jews understood by the term 'Son of Man'. [6]	
	(c)	'It is not surprising that the Jewish religious authorities saw Jesus as a threat and a blasphemer.' To what extent do you agree? Show in your answer that you have considered more than one point of view.
