Equality in Northern Ireland

One of the ways the Northern Ireland government promotes equality is by passing equality laws such as the Equal Pay Act. Equality laws help to protect people from discrimination.

Although equality laws help to ensure people have equal opportunities, people in minority groups may still feel marginalised in society. They may still face discrimination and lack representation in government.

The Northern Ireland Equality Commission aims to promote equality and reduce discrimination. One of the roles of the Equality Commission is to ensure equality laws are upheld. It also provides advice to people who feel that they have been discriminated against.
